Welcome to all our new and existing Parents/Carers. The children have settled back into their routine at Nursery and are enjoying all the exciting activities we have in store for them this half term. Our February intakes have also begun to settle in well.

## Spring Two - What your child will be learning this term?

As we have started seeing some trees blossoming and daffodils blooming, it tells us that spring is almost here. This half term our topic is Minibeasts/Growth & Decay. We will be learning about various minibeasts we see in our gardens during the spring season. We will also explore how plants, flowers, fruits & vegetables grow, what they need to make them grow and how to care for them. As a class, we will plant our own sunflowers and water cress and observe them grow. The children will also bring home their individual flowers that they have planted at school to look after them at home.

Our books for this half term will be 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar', Jack and the beanstalk, Mad about Minibeast and Oliver's Vegetables. You can read these books with your children at home or watch them on YouTube.

# How can I support my child at home?



In phonics, we learn and practice letter sounds using the Little Wandle Phonics Scheme. In the 3 & 4 year-old room, we are learning the phase two sounds (SATPIN). The children will learn a new sound every week, which will help them to recognise sounds and blend them together to form words when they start to read. This term, you can read different books about Spring with your children or talk to them about the changes in the weather, look for minibeasts in the garden or at the park. When you are out and about with them, stop and observe the blossoms on the trees and talk about it. Encourage them to plant with you at home or help to tidy up the garden to broaden your child's knowledge about our topic.
